We have two wonderful Honey suppliers locally who provide us with beautiful golden honey. One type, which is set, comes from Mr Bolam in Hill View, and the other, runny honey, is produced by Roy Bennett and is called "Bishops Caundle Honey". Our two bee keepers are on hand to talk about their beehives and have been an important contact for new enthusiasts coming into the village.

Another local business we use is Sun Cottage who provides us with our Luxury Muesli, Granola & Porridge Oats as well as dried spices for all your cooking needs.

We have cooked meat supplies from Buttling Butchers at Ludwell near Shaftesbury who supply Pasties, sausage rolls, scotch eggs and pork pies. These are all very popular with our passing drivers in need of a quick bite at lunchtime. The Southfield Family at Wincanton supply us with a range of sweet and savoury pies and pasties. These are proving increasingly popular

We stock the famous Wyke Farm Butter and selected cheddar cheese from their comprehensive range, all made just across the border in Somerset, and now exported all over the world.

Sandwiches and Snacks

We will also soon be stocking a wider range of sandwiches and snacks, looking for items especially made here in Dorset. Please tell us if you would be interested in gluten or dairy free products or if there are other lines which you would like us to consider, including vegetarian and vegan meals. Next year there will be an opportunity to taste. We are planning to have a Taster Evening early next year, so look out for more details.

Woodbridge Farm also makes a range of chutneys, all made happily at home on the farm.

Then there is Dorset Tea, cups of sunshine using tea from the rainforest-alliance where farmers are able to make a proper living.

For Coffee drinkers we have Old Dorset Roast, a strong flavoured coffee with notes of caramel in the body and chocolate after taste. Also made by the 918 Coffee Company, we have our own Bishops Caundle

The proposed changes to the layout and operation were impractical and would have resulted in closure. Serena spent many hours preparing paperwork to support the facts that this PO serves a large community in a rural area and that there are members of our community who do not have access to transport and who would be badly affected if the PO closed. It is rewarding to know that she was listened to and the services are, at least for the time being, secured as a Community PO.

The rather trite phrase "use it or lose it" was very nearly a reality last week so please do continue to use the Post Office facilities. It is most rewarding for staff and volunteers to see their hard work supported by an increase in sales from users of the PO facilities.
